What restoration methods should be employed on the ship which has given many people a unique on board experience while plying the waters of Port Phillip and the River Yarra?

Anthony Mansfield will provide an insight into the controversy surrounding the work being undertaken on the Steam Tug Wattle. With the ship now being re-clad with steel plates, this fascinating classic mechanical relic, from a



distant era is due to return service once again in 2013.
