Report from the President

Welcome to our first newsletter for 2008. It is pleasing to be able to report on two positive initiatives that hopefully will lead to a resurgence in interest in our rich maritime heritage.

From the time of its formation some five years ago, the principal objective of the MHAV has been to promote the establishment of a major maritime heritage precinct in the Melbourne area, for the benefit of all Victorians and visitors to our state. We quickly identified the former Port of Melbourne workshops site at Williamstown as our preferred location for a development which we described as "a maritime Sovereign Hill", a place that would bring our rich maritime heritage to life for young and old alike, in a working heritage port environment. Our vision was to create a home base for our fleet of heritage vessels and visiting tall ships, with the necessary infrastructure to keep them operating on a sustainable basis, amid a vibrant mix of maritime related educational, recreational and commercial businesses and community activities.

After five years of uncertainty surrounding the future of the site, we are pleased to report the first tentative step towards our vision, with the release of a Strategic Statement by Seaworks Foundation.

We are fortunate to have arranged for Trevor Huggard, a director of Seaworks Foundation and former Lord Mayor of Melbourne, to present the Strategic Statement at a members night scheduled for the 26th April (Refer to separate invitation enclosed). This will be a great opportunity for members to learn more about the planning process for the site, and to ask questions of Trevor on the content of the Strategic Statement. Copies of the Strategic Statement document will also be made available for those who attend. Trevor will also be able to talk of his experience with the redevelopment of the Abbotsford Convent, which was successfully completed as a government / community partnership, along the lines proposed for the Williamstown maritime precinct.

We are hopeful that representatives from Victoria University TAFE College will also be present to provide information on their proposal for establishing their boat building school in the large shed.

While the Strategic Statement is a positive first step in the redevelopment process, it is only the beginning, and the Seaworks Foundation has committed to consulting widely with the community during the development of a detailed plan for the site. It is very important therefore that we send a very clear message about the aspects of the development that we consider to be important for the future preservation of our maritime heritage. This is an opportunity not to be missed, and we look forward to a strong turnout at the members night to show that the people of this community care about our maritime heritage, and that the MHAV will be a key contributor to the consultation process.

It is heartening to see the efforts of the *Alma Doepel* Supporters Cub as they raise funds for the return of this fine vessel to her previous home in Melbourne. It appears that the club and Sail and Adventure Limited, the owner of the vessel now have strong management teams in place to take on this challenge. The MHAV strongly supports their efforts and was pleased to recently make a donation of \$500 to the *Alma Doepel* Refit Fund, a major fund raising effort in aid of the return and refitting of the ship in Melbourne. I urge members to support this effort which we hope will see *Alma* once again gracing the waters of Port Phillip.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at our future activities.

RECENT ACTIVITIES - James Craig CHARTERS

Many readers will be aware that the visit of the Sydney Heritage Fleet's 1874 built barque *James Craig* to Melbourne in January / February was marred by a major mechanical breakdown in one of the vessel's two gearboxes. Because the ship needs both engines operational for passenger services, all of the charters arranged prior to the visit were cancelled at relatively short notice. The MHAV was able to communicate with most of our (more than 200) ticket holders prior to our two scheduled dates, and all booking monies were subsequently refunded. Our thanks go to Miles Allen for bearing the brunt of this logistical challenge. A large number of visitors inspected the ship during her stay at Workshops Pier, Williamstown, again highlighting the value of this venue for visiting heritage vessels. We apologise to those who were disappointed in missing out on a wonderful experience – we will endeavour to participate in any future visits of the ship to Melbourne, and suggest that anyone interested in sailing aboard *James Craig* may obtain details of public sails from Sydney on the Sydney Heritage Fleet web site at www.shf.org.au

REPORTS ON HERITAGE VESSELS

ALMA DOEPEL: TOPSAIL SCHOONER: The *Alma Doepel* remains laid up in Port Macquarie while work has been continuing on plans for her relocation to Melbourne and refit. Sail & Adventure Limited, the owners and operators of the ship, intend to return Alma to survey and undertake Sail Training voyages in Port Phillip, including a focus on marine science, along with public day and weekend trips and charter work.

Positive negotiations have been ongoing prior to the ship's arrival in Melbourne. Plans are being developed for two options for Alma's relocation, either via a tow or under her own power. It is intended that the ship be slipped in Port Macquarie in late April 2008 in preparation for the relocation to Port Phillip.

During January 2008 the Alma Doepel Supporters Club established the Alma Doepel Refit Fund to assist with fundraising for her relocation and refit. Donations to this fund would be greatly appreciated. Volunteers and donations in kind are also being sought to assist with the refit project once the ship is in Melbourne. CERBERUS: MONITOR: Since the Federal election the Friends of Cerberus have been encouraging the new federal government, through Minister for Environment, Heritage and the Arts Peter Garrett, to join with the Victorian Minister for the Planning Justin Madden in arranging joint funding for the stabilisation of this historic ship in situ at Black Rock. This is a \$7million project and must proceed before further hull collapse, which may mean very limited time is available. CURLIP: REPLICA PADDLE STEAMER: Under construction at Orbost. The boiler and engine are in the vessel with deck and superstructure work now progressing. LADY CHELMSFORD: EXCURSION VESSEL: This ex Sydney 1910 built timber ex steam ferry which has been laid up pending possible return to commercial service, sank suddenly at the berth at 14 Victoria Harbour on 18 February 2008. At the time of writing plans for her raising are still being finalised and the vessel's future is uncertain. A major difficulty is the now critical shortage of suitable sites in Port Phillip Bay to slip and work on such vessels.



ENTERPRIZE: REPLICA SCHOONER:

Melbourne's tall ship, the schooner *Enterprize*, continues to serve the community in many different ways. Later in March she is returning from another successful visit to Port Fairv for the Music Festival and Portland. The westward bound voyage has become a regular event, being part of the state government's sponsored Regional Schools Program. Many country school students visit the ship to experience our maritime heritage. Ocean passages offer an opportunity for fare paying passengers to experience sailing "the good old way". For those who missed out on a sail on the James Craig, the Enterprize offers a range of sailing experiences over the next few months, keeping in mind that we are entering what is typically Melbourne's most settled weather during autumn. On the 29 March, Enterprize will be sailing to Geelong, returning on Sunday. The Overnight Adventure Sail departing from Williamstown on Friday 11 April is booked out, but there is another one on 16 May, so book early. On Sunday 20 April, the ship will be

sailing from Gem Pier. The mid-week schools program continues.

OTAMA: SUBMARINE: The Association awaits Council resolution of its planning application to bring the *Oberon* class submarine *Otama* ashore at Crib Point in Western Port. This is dependent on a forthcoming VCAT or Ministerial decision on the proposal for a bitumen plant next door, which if successful would not allow the submarine project to proceed. Both the council and community oppose the bitumen plant proposal. The Maritime Centre at Crib Point is currently open in weekends 10.30 – 3.30, phone 5983 9102 direct, and *Otama* remains moored just offshore. The Association is involved with the Merchant Navy RSL in recording oral history related to WWII convoy experiences while people involved are still available.

POLLY WOODSIDE: BARQUE AND MARITIME MUSEUM: BMT Defence Contracting is about to present their report on the condition of Polly's hull and on conserving the ship to the Trust whilst the government Major Projects organisation is developing proposals for refurbishing the dry dock.

The National Trust is currently reviewing plans for the new Museum including sheds 2 and 4 and taking into account the priority to maintain and present *Polly Woodside*. Announcements are expected soon. Shed 2 is expected to be rebuilt on site in mid 2008 with the final site arrangement required to be ready for opening together with the new Melbourne Exhibition and Convention Centre in March 2009.

Tanya Williams was appointed in March to the position of Heritage Development Manager for the site, Steven Cooke having resigned early in 2008.

WATTLE: STEAM TUG: At last some better news. Owners Bay Steamers Maritime Museum Ltd have negotiated a proposal with Sorrento Steam, whereby that organisation would fund necessary work to return the ship to commercial operation in 2008 and become the vessel owner. Bay Steamers would remain responsible for running the ship which would operate from Sorrento during summer periods and from Melbourne for the rest of the year. Sorrento Steam comprises a group of Peninsula enthusiasts with support from many local organisations who plan to reintroduce the steam tram at Sorrento and see steam tug *Wattle* as a logical extension of the land based operation. This proposal and in particular the sale of the vessel to another organisation has raised strongly held and diverse opinions amongst Bay Steamers members and as a result a concerned group of members have made an alternative proposal. These proposals will be discussed and it is expected will be voted on at an Extraordinary General Meeting of members on 31 March 2008.

Wattle remains berthed at No. 2 Victoria Harbour where there is public access and she was steamed by volunteers on Australia Day 2008 as part of the parade organised by Tall Ships Victoria on that day. Contact: Brian Ashton. Ph: 9467 1167. Email: brianashton@pacific.net.au
